
#### Featured Artist: Dustin Newman Unignax



Techniques, and Settings for Success with Don Kluting

Saturday, June 3rd: 3:30PM - 5:00PM - Indoors

Learn how to use the settings on your camera to get the photos you desire. Cameras to be covered include basic point-and-shoot to DSLR's and everything in between. Covered topics will include going beyond the automatic settings, the basics of shutter speed, aperture, and ISO.
